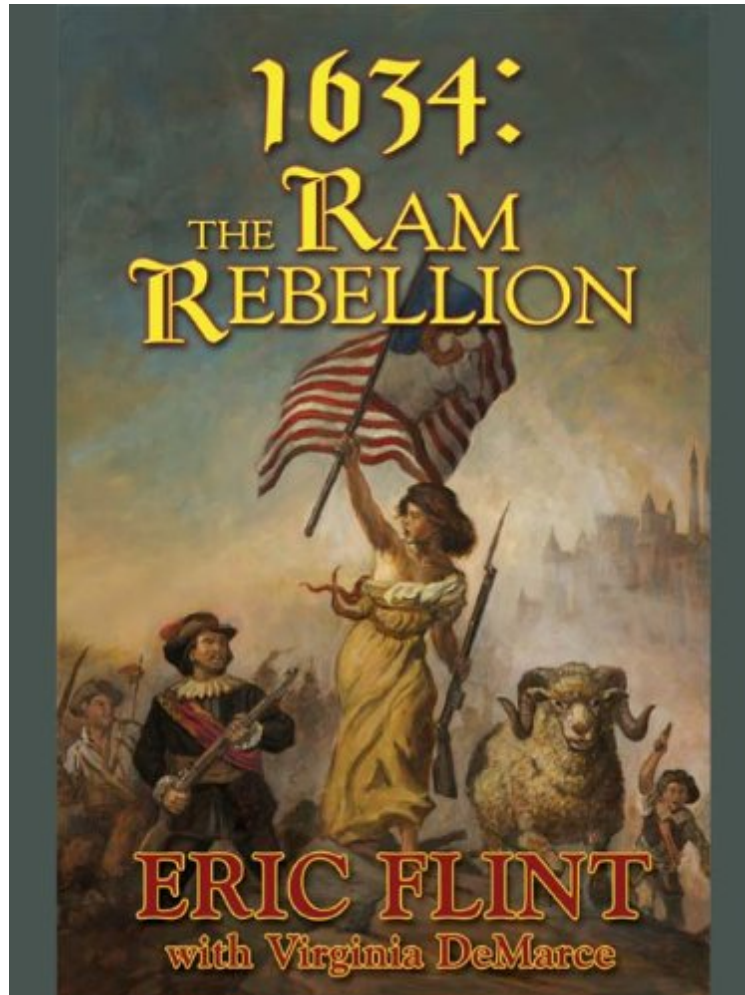

The little sideline, as far as I remember, reads "Mike has got half of Franconia and he's shooting for all of it".This book is a collection of short stories vaguely connected by the general theme "Takeover of the administration of Franconia by the Americans".The stories contained herein are written by several authors. This leads to a slightly uneven read, as each author uses different persons and points of view. Nevertheless, all the stories are interconnected and influence each

other, so they fit together well enough to give a good overview of the process. Some of the stories are truly excellent, some merely good. The main theme of the book is the incorporation of Franconia into the NUS, and one of the big problems it faces is the really awful mess of land ownership in 1631 Germany. The first Uptimer to find out about that is Birdie Newhouse in part one: "Recipes for Revolution", but it stays with the reader throughout the book. Brillo, the ram from hell, is another one of the threads connecting the short stories in this collection. His amazing career starts on a farm in Grantville and ends on the banners of a revolution. He too, gets a whole part of the book for himself: "Enter the Ram". The last two parts take place in Franconia, "The trouble in Franconia" and "The Ram Rebellion". Especially in these last two parts, a lot of information is given in discussions and talks. So it makes for a rather slow read, if one does not want to overlook some important details or lose the situational context. This may be a bit tedious if you expect that action drives the plot forward (which it does, just not all of the time), but on the other hand it is also fun to see how the bits and pieces mentioned in the individual stories build up into the big picture.
