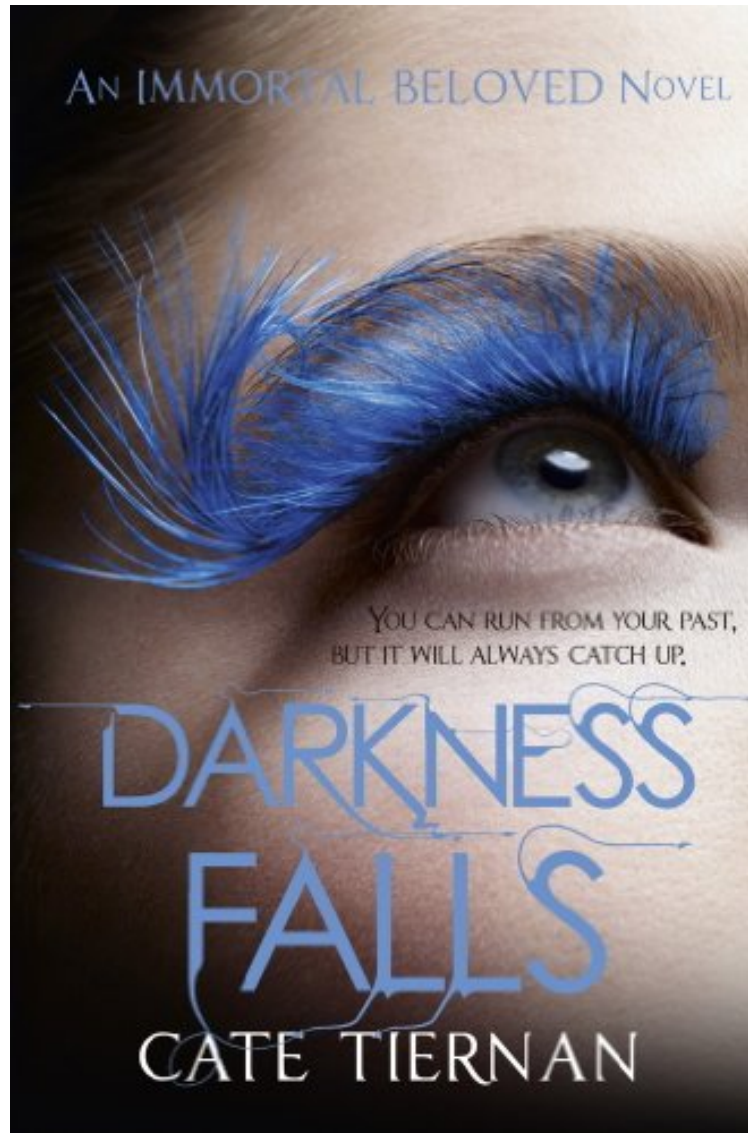

hundreds of years, but for some reason it never seems to get any easier. She's left behind her days of debauchery to find peace and forgiveness at River's Edge, a safe haven for wayward immortals. There she's uncovered her family's epic history, reclaimed her magickal powers, and met Reyn, whom she dubs "the Viking god." Just as she settles into her new life, Nastasya learns that her old friends might be in town...Reuniting with her gorgeous and dangerous ex-best-friend, Innocencio, Nas wonders if she'll ever be truly free of her dark legacy. Is Incy dangerous, power-hungry, and wicked? Or is he the only one who truly understands Nas's darkness? Either way, Nas is desperate to find out who she really is—even if the answer kills her.

ReviewThe first "Immortal Beloved"-Book took me by surprise and in a good way: having read the synopsis about an immortal girl that experiences a breakdown and goes into the rehab-equivalent for immortals, I was hesitant to read it and it got stuck in my "to-be-read-pile" for quite a while. However, once I started the book, I could not lay it down and worldbuilding, characters and story got my undivided attention until I was at the last page. And: I suffered from having to wait for the next book in the trilogy. And I'm glad that "Darkness Falls", the second book in this trilogy, is finally out and one of the main themes, about her friend Incy that was still unsolved at the end of book one, was closed - actually in a "grande finale"-kind of way. And I liked it! Especially since it felt like a turning point for Nastasya and I'm very curious, what kind of a person she will be in the end of this trilogy. As a matter of fact, she came a very long way, character-development-wise from the beginning of book one until the end of book two and I appreciate it, if a character shows relatable development. And I think that Ms. Tiernan does a great job describing an immortal woman that lives for more than 400 years and is really old and experienced and at the same time very much a person of the meantime. Nas was born in Iceland and has experienced what was normal for women at that time, but seems [thank goodness] very unreal for us: viking raiders, being afraid of being raped and killed and having to seek other's protection for the sake of her own freedom. And it's really comprehensible, what kind of person Nas has become, because of the years of being afraid, as well as the following [hundreds of] years of living a shallow life and being the personification of hedonism. Nas thinks of episodes she experienced in her past and these flashbacks are one of the main strengths of this book: the always feel "real" and Nas is always described as the person she was at that time, because of what she had lived through until that moment. Another strong feature is the whole cast of characters in the book - they are all fleshed out, none feels unnecessary and each of them has his or her own story and as it is with Nas, their behavior and actions always make sense for them being the persons they are. Ok, besides Nas I do love Reyn, the "Viking God" - and one of the downsides of this book compared to book one, was the absence of Reyn, even when he was in the scene. I just didn't "feel" him as much as in the first book. But I understand that this was necessary because mostly this is the story of Nas' personal development. I liked the book, although it's not as new and surprising as the first book was. It is more about thought and talk than action or events, but the occurrences at the end promise some action in the final "Immortal Beloved"-book and I will definitely read it. As I mentioned a few times, "Darkness Falls" is the second book in a trilogy, so I recommend to start with book one, "Immortal Beloved".
