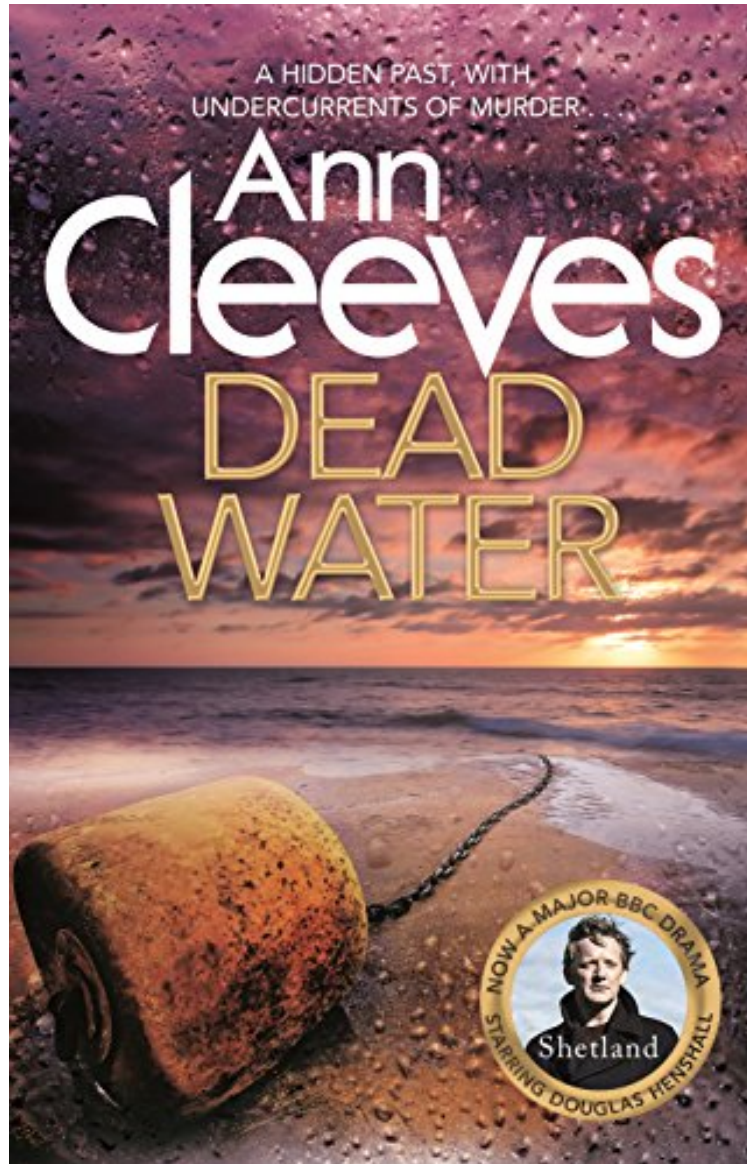

Dabei verletzt sie eine der wichtigsten Grundregeln eines whodunit: "never to conceal a vital clue from the reader". Es nervt wirklich, wenn Spannung dadurch erzeugt wird, dass der Ermittler Fakten entdeckt und Spuren findet, aber dem Leser nur nebulse Andeutungen mitgeteilt werden. Deshalb leider nur drei Punkte.
