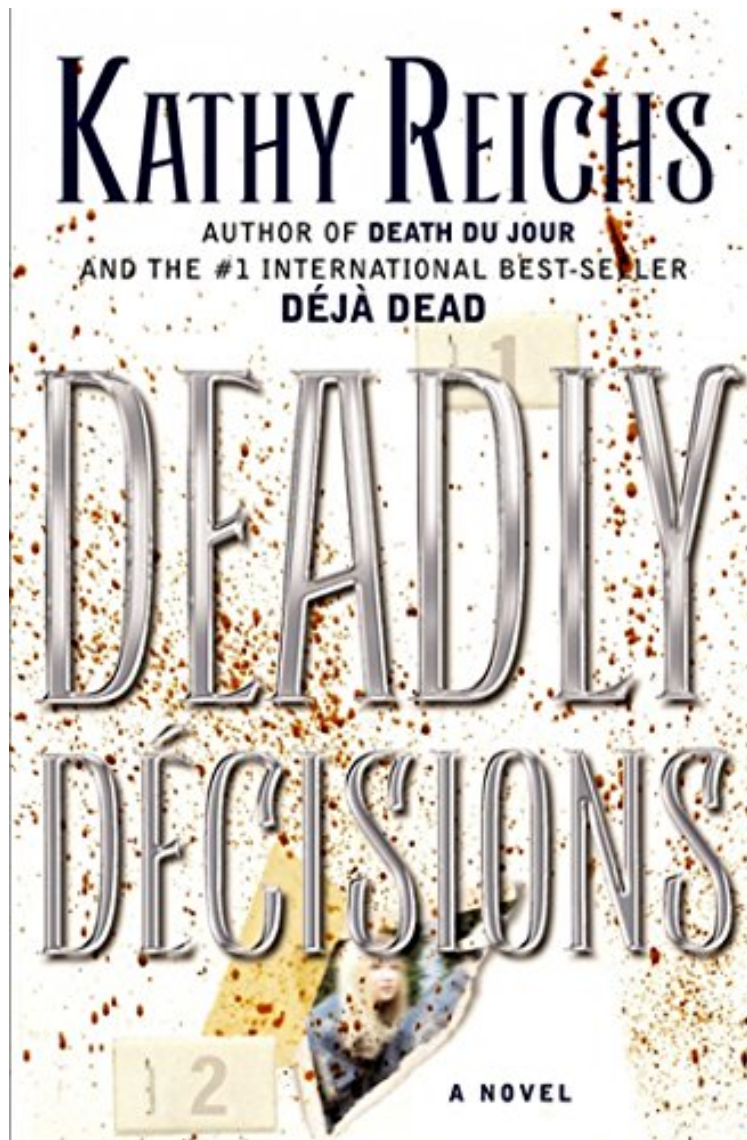

thriller. Her science is impeccable, her characters are believably complex and her plotting and pacing are nearly flawless. It is about how the anthropologist Temperance Brennan clears up the homicide of the 9 year old girl Emily Anne Toussaint, fatally shot on a Montreal street during a motorcycle - gang war and how she discovers parts of a skeleton of a North Carolina teenager hundreds of miles away from where she disappeared. As in all of her books, Kathy Reichs brings her real - life forensic expertise in. As I started reading the book, I was immediately captivated by it. Excitement survives until the very end of the book that promises reading - enjoyment towards the end. The book is not too hard to understand, although some expressions concerning forensic science and a little French appear. But these expressions are in no way interrupting during reading. On the contrary, these expressions evoke a feeling of being in a different country and support escaping of the real world. Easy Decision- Read It Von Tim Smith In this, Kathy Reich's third book, Tempe Brennan, a forensic anthropologist, splits time between North Carolina and Montreal. She has been assigned as liaison to Operation Carcajou, a task force on criminal activities of motorcycle gangs. The setting for the story occurs mainly in the Canadian spring " when the thaw offers up the dead, hidden by the snows of a long winter". Two skeletons are found as well as the skull and leg bones of a teen whose body had been lain to rest in North Carolina in 1984. The mystery facing Tempe is to determine how the skull ended up in Montreal and what is the connection to the skeletons of the two motorcycle gang members buried with it. To complicate her life and add depth to the story, Tempe's love interest, Andrew Ryan, has been arrested for selling drugs. Her nephew Kit, whom she treats like her own son, has come to visit and is fascinated by Harley Davidsons. As the story progresses, she becomes more concerned and worried as Kit becomes involved with intrusive slime-ball reporter Lyle Crease, who also has a love for motorcycles. She becomes afraid for Kit and feels a sense of urgency as bikers are killing each other in a power struggle for the drug trade. The decisions faced by these characters is the underlying theme of the story. Tempe is presented as a three-dimensional, increasingly complex and sensitive woman expressing her beliefs, fears, attitudes, and feelings. The book is written in the first person so we are privy to Tempe's innermost thoughts. She is a serious and dedicated scientist but we also learn of her feelings toward victims, perpetrators, co-workers, family, and herself. From the beginning, she describes how she feels about children and how she respects victims of violence. She has vowed to use her talent of interpreting evidence and "reading bones" to identify and convict the perps of violent crime especially against children. As Kathy Reich continues to write, she creates plots and characters with depth while using creative techniques that add to the suspense. For example, I found myself looking forward to the end of most chapters. They usually contained a surprise or made a point that moved the story, making it difficult to "put down the book ". She ties the story together brilliantly at the conclusion while leaving an opening and running a common thread to the next book if she wants to use it. She provides consulting services to the Laboratoire de Sciences Judiciaires et de Medecine Legale and to the North Carolina Chief Medical Examiner. She also teaches body recovery workshops at the FBI academy. Currently, Temperance is looking at the remains of two identical twins killed in an explosion. Due to the genetic match of the siblings DNA testing cannot help her. Temperance joins a multiagency task force investigating this case. Law enforcement official arrest a biker, who in exchange for a lighter sentence leads the group to other buried members including a teenage girl. As Temperance gets closer to the truth her about the latest biker wars, her own life is placed in jeopardy from the killers who prefer to remain in the cold murdering targeted bikers. On any reader test scale, Kelly Reichs' latest work, DEADLY DECISIONS, matches up well with the best of Cornwell. The tale centers on biker gangs that engage in criminal activities rather than the hobbyist enjoying their motorcycle. The frightening story line focuses on a fascinating depraved world that is a thrill a page as the terrific Temperance tries to solve an impossible case without becoming a coroner's next evaluation.
